**Commissioner Levin moved approval of the application; Commissioner Shimel seconded. The vote passed unanimously (2-0).**

**6. APPLICATION FOR A NEW COMMON VICTUALLER LICENSE, FOR A NEW SEASONAL WINE & MALT RESTAURANT LICENSE, AND FOR CONVERSION OF SEASONAL WINE & MALT RESTAURANT LICENSE TO ANNUAL WINE & MALT RESTAURANT LICENSE**

The Roost Northampton, LLC d/b/a The Roost  
1 Market Street, Northampton, MA 01060  
Proposed Manager: Adam Dunetz

Commissioner Shimel noted that this is a public hearing.

Adam Dunetz and Robyn Goodmark were present for the application. Mr. Dunetz owns The Green Bean on Main Street. This new establishment will be on Market Street, formerly the Pop's Package Store. This will be a café/dessert bar open 8am-11pm with breakfast and lunch, to-go items, and evenings will have up to six beers, wine and desserts.

Commissioner Shimel asked Mr. Dunetz his experience with liquor service. Mr. Dunetz has not had experience with liquor service as an owner, but has over 20 years experience in restaurant business.

Commissioner Levin asked if Mr. Dunetz is applying for an Entertainment license. Mr. Dunetz replied that, at this time, it is not part of this restaurant business plan. Seating is for up to 49, with 40-46 in the concept of the floor plan. There will be no wait service, but there will be seating. The downstairs is for employees only, with the establishment preparing their own desserts.

Commissioner Shimel noted that there were no persons present to object, thereby closing the public hearing.

**Commissioner Shimel approved the 16C for this application; Commissioner Levin seconded. The vote passed unanimously (2-0).**

**Commissioner Shimel moved approval of the Common Victualler license, New Seasonal Wine & Malt Restaurant license application, and Conversion of Seasonal Wine & Malt license to Annual Wine & Malt license application, contingent upon approval by the ABCC; Commissioner Levin seconded. The vote passed unanimously (2-0).**

**7. APPLICATION FOR TRANSFER OF A CLASS I CAR DEALER LICENSE**

Current Licensee: Northampton Ford, Inc., 55 Damon Road, Northampton, Roger Jourdain, President

Proposed Licensee: Family Ford of Northampton, Inc., 55 Damon Road, John S. Sarat, Jr., President

Attorney Greg Schmidt, John Sarat, and Scott Sarat were present for the application. This is a change in ownership, with no visible changes, save a new sign face. Mr. Sarat currently owns two other Ford dealerships in Agawam and Enfield. This applicant has zoning approval. The applicant is waiting for internal approval from Ford Corporate.

**Commissioner Levin moved approval of the transfer; Commissioner Shimel seconded. The vote passed unanimously (2-0).**

**8. PUBLIC HEARING Regarding Sunday Entertainment Licenses**

Commissioner Shimel noted that this is a public hearing.

Commissioner Shimel took this item out of agenda order. Assistant City Attorney Andrew Bruce McAmis was present to discuss this item. This affects establishments with liquor license On-Premise (Section 12) only. Commissioner Shimel noted that, in the past, non-liquor licensed establishments would request Sunday Entertainment licenses through the Mayor's office.

Attorney McAmis advised that the License Commission should allow these licenses to be "Entertainment" for seven days per Chapter 140 Section 183A. The fee for the annual license should be no more than \$100.00. The current annual license fee is \$80.00.

Commissioner Shimel noted that pool halls are regulated by Chapter 136, Section 4, for license on Sunday.

Going forward, Attorney McAmis also advised that there is no need to adjust the City Ordinance that speaks to Chapter 136.

Northampton Media news reported David Reid asked the Commission if there is anything to prevent current entertainment license holders from operating Sunday entertainment. There is not. Mr. Reid asked why this is an issue.

Commissioner Shimel explained that the License Commission was concerned to clarify the license to be in compliance with Massachusetts state laws.

Commissioner Levin also explained that the License Commission now realizes that Chapter 140 Section 183A, as on our present licenses, allows for seven days' entertainment.

Commissioner Shimel closed the public hearing, and thanked Attorney McAmis for his attendance and advice.

The Clerk will adjust all "Weekday Entertainment" licenses to be "Entertainment" licenses for Sunday through Saturday use. All establishments will receive notice of this change with renewal paperwork to be mailed November 2, 2010.

## **9. PUBLIC HEARING Regarding 10 AM Liquor Sales on Sundays**

Commissioner Shimel noted that this is a public hearing.

Commissioner Shimel noted that the City Council approved the Order regarding this on September 2, 2010, as in Step 1 of the "Alcoholic Beverages Control Commission Memorandum on 10 a.m. Sunday Sales by §12 License Holders" dated July 13, 2010.

This hearing addresses Steps 2 and 3 of the above memorandum. Commissioner Shimel noted that the Northampton License Commission may choose to grant all §12 Licensees to sell at 10 a.m. on Sundays, or may require each licensee to apply and the Commission would grant on a case-by-case basis.

David Reid questioned the Commission regarding bars versus restaurants, and did the establishment have to serve food? Mr. Reid questioned whether bars should open earlier.

Commissioner Shimel stated that the Northampton License Commission is given this decision to grant the 10 a.m. Sunday sales or not to grant.

Commissioner Levin stated that there is a different logic, as liquor licenses are valuable, and any new Seasonal Wine & Malt licenses that are granted must serve food.

Commissioner Shimel stated that the hour difference would not alter behavior. Some people work late or different shifts and may be at a bar or restaurant at 10 a.m. This allowance might also expand sales for bars and restaurants.

Commissioner Shimel closed the public hearing.

**Commissioner Shimel moved to allow 10AM Sales of Liquor on Sunday to all Section 12 Licensees. Commissioner Levin seconded. The vote passed unanimously (2-0).**

*\*Clerk's Note: Step 4 was completed on October 6, 2010 and acknowledgment from ABCC dated October 15, 2010 is attached.*

The Clerk requested a clarification – she is about to mail renewal paperwork to all licensees, and to change all 2010 licenses now would be an extra cost to the City for mailing, paper, etc.

**Commissioner Levin moved to undo the previous motion and allow 10AM Sales of Liquor on Sunday to all Section 12 Licensees, effective on January 1, 2011. If any current licensee wishes to come to the License Commission office before that date to be allowed to serve at 10am on Sundays, they may do so, and the Clerk will change the 2010 License to reflect this. All 2011 renewed Section 12 On-Premise licenses will reflect the 10 a.m. Sunday sales. Commissioner Shimel seconded. The vote passed unanimously (2-0).**

*Clerk's note: Mansour Ghalibaf, manager of Mananto Enterprises, LLC d/b/a Hotel Northampton, Wiggins Tavern/Coolidge Park Café came into the License Commission office on October 12, 2010 and the Clerk changed Liquor License #090000019 to read "Sundays 10 a.m. to 1:00 a.m."*

#### **10. Approval of Minutes of July 21, 2010 and September 1, 2010**

**Commissioner Levin moved approval of the minutes; Commissioner Shimel seconded. The vote passed unanimously (2-0).**

#### **11. Police Request for a Special Meeting of the License Commission for Wednesday, October 20, 2010 at 4:00 pm to hear a Violation Hearing RE: Paradise City Tavern**

- Request to Hire Catuogno Court Reporting

Commissioner Shimel stated that, given the gravity of the allegations, the meeting should be set, and the Court Reported be hired.

**Commissioner Shimel approved the special meeting be set for October 20, 2010\*; Commissioner Levin seconded. The vote passed unanimously (2-0).**

*\*Regarding the Special License Commission meeting October 20, 2010:  
On October 14, 2010, the Northampton License Commission received a formal request for a continuation of the Violation Hearing. On October 15, 2010, the Northampton License Commission approved the continuation of the Violation Hearing to Tuesday, November 9, 2010 at 4:00 p.m. in City Council Chambers, 212 Main Street, Northampton, MA.*

## **12. Approval of the 2011 Renewal of Licenses**

The Clerk presented a memo to the Northampton License Commission (Attached).

David Reid questioned this item. Commissioners explained that this is the approval of the *process of* renewals of current licenses for 2011. All licensees must complete paperwork and make payment of licenses for 2011.

**Commissioner Shimel moved approval of the process of renewals of licenses for 2011; Commissioner Levin seconded. The vote passed unanimously (2-0).**

## **13. NEW BUSINESS –**

The Clerk explained that this is an application for Smith Vocational and Agricultural High School Culinary Arts Restaurant, with a request for a Fee Waiver as this is a City entity.

**Commissioner Shimel moved approval of the application; Commissioner Levin seconded. The vote passed unanimously (2-0).**

**At 5:00 p.m., Commissioner Shimel moved to adjourn and was seconded by Commissioner Levin. The vote passed unanimously (2-0).**

## MEMORANDUM

TO: Mary Midura  
Executive Secretary to the Northampton City Licensing Commission

RE: Sunday Entertainment Licensing for Inn Holders, Common Victuallers, etc.

---

My review of Massachusetts law and City ordinances leads me to conclude that the maximum fee for an annual, 7 day per week, entertainment license is \$100. This conclusion is based upon my reading of M.G.L. Chap. 140, § 183A and City Ordinance §§ 124-1 and 174-3. I cannot find any authority to legally justify the City's recent practice of issuing "Weekday Entertainment Licenses" and charging \$80 therefore.

I believe that the confusion over the relevant licensing requirements for Sundays is a result of the fact that many entertainments do require special Sunday licensing pursuant to M.G.L. Ch. 136, § 4. For instance, pool halls that do not serve alcoholic beverages would require special Sunday licenses under Chapter 136, Section 4. However, that statute specifically states that the "provisions of this section shall not apply to premises licensed under the provisions of section one hundred and eighty-three A of chapter one hundred forty." M.G.L. Ch. 136, § 4(6).

Chapter 140, section 183A applies to entertainments offered by establishments that serve alcohol for consumption on the premises as authorized by M.G.L. Ch. 138, § 12. This section applies seven days per week and the annual licenses authorized by this section have an expiration date of December 31<sup>st</sup>.

In light of these findings I suggest the following course of action:

1. Contact all current entertainment license holders and inform that the correct fee is \$100.
2. Inform all current license holders that they can offer 7 day per week entertainment under these licenses (providing they meet all other municipal and state rules regarding health and safety standards).

For future renewals and additional applications the municipal fee is \$100. Additionally, I think that you should advise all licensees to submit a copy of their renewed City license along with a cover letter and payment of \$100 to the Department of Public Safety in Boston for the commissioner's approval of this entertainment license as called for by Chapter 140, § 183A.

I also want to call the Commission's attention to another related issue. The Northampton City Ordinances do not seem to provide a basis for seven day entertainment licenses in establishments regulated under Chapter 140, section 183A. Section 124-1 provides for Sunday entertainment licensing and Section 174-3 details the fee schedule for such licensing. The Ordinances and fee schedule do not expressly provide for entertainment licensing on days other than Sunday. I suggest that the Commission initiate discussions with the City Council on a proposal to amend the Ordinances to expressly provide for the seven day licensing in those establishments that serve alcohol on premises.

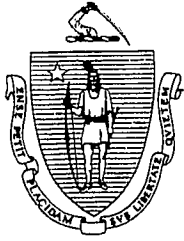

THE ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES CONTROL COMMISSION MEMORANDUM ON 10 a.m.  
SUNDAY SALES BY §12 LICENSE HOLDERS

Effective July 1, 2010, a new law amending M.G.L. c. 138, §33B authorizes local liquor licensing authorities ("LLA") to permit M.G.L. c. 138, §12 licensees to sell alcoholic beverages at 10 a.m. on Sundays. On July 2, 2010, the Alcoholic Beverages Control Commission issued an Advisory on the recent change to the law that controls Sunday Sales by §12 licensees. Since the ABCC issued the advisory, it has continued to receive inquiries from local licensing authorities ("LLAs") and attorneys on the process required to implement this change.

The amendment grants LLA's the discretionary authority to expand the permissible hours of sale of alcoholic beverages on Sundays. In order to take advantage of the law, each city or town must "opt into" it. Once a city or town has "opted in" the LLA's have discretion to allow any or every §12 licensee in their community to sell alcoholic beverages on Sundays, starting at 10 a.m.

Four (4) steps are necessary to implement this change and allow any or every §12 licensee to sell alcoholic beverages at 10 a.m. on Sundays.

- Step 1: M.G.L. c. 138, § 33B, as most recently amended, must be accepted and "activated" in the community.
- Step 2: Once the amended law has been "activated" in the community, the LLA must decide how it will administer its newly expanded discretionary hours of sale. Each LLA may choose to grant these discretionary hours of sale
- (a) to every §12 licensee to sell at the maximum hours now authorized by §33B or
  - (b) to wait for applications by each individual §12 licensee and thereby choose whether to grant the additional discretionary hours of sale on a case-by-case basis.
- Step 3: The LLA must hold a hearing that complies with the Open Meeting Law to grant the newly expanded discretionary hours of sale to any or every §12 licensee.
- Step 4: ABCC approval for these discretionary hours of sale is not required; but as always the LLA must forward an informational "Form 43" with the Sunday hours of sale to the ABCC. A §12 license holder who is denied the discretionary hour of sale may not appeal that denial to the ABCC.

The ABCC does not take a legal position or interpretation of the process required by M.G.L. c. 138, §33B, and defers to legal counsel for the individual cities and towns to advise the LLA on the process required to administer this recent change. However, any LLA that currently grants 11 a.m. openings to §12 licensees may wish to review its municipal records to determine the process previously taken to effectuate § 33B in the community. The prior action taken to accept the earlier version of §33B (first enacted in 1979) may already give the LLA the legal discretion to consider granting 10 a.m. openings. For example, the LLA or other municipal body may have previously voted to accept the provisions of M.G.L. c. 138, §33B thereby also accepting this most recent 2010 amendment. If however, the LLA or other municipal body did not previously vote to accept the provisions of M.G.L. c. 138, § 33B, but voted only to authorize 11 a.m. openings on Sundays, then a further process is required to effectuate the additional hour of sale on Sundays.

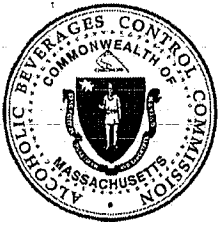
