The polls will be opened at seven o'clock in the forenoon and closed at eight o'clock in the evening of the said day, and all voters will within the said hours in the wards in which they are individually entitled to vote give in their votes for Mayor for the two ensuing municipal years, for City Clerk for the two ensuing municipal years, for City Treasurer for the two ensuing municipal years, for two Councillors at Large for the two ensuing municipal years, for one Councillor from each of the seven wards of the City for the two ensuing municipal years, for two members of the School Committee at Large for two years from the first Monday of January, 2006, for four members of the school committee to serve for four years from the first Monday of January, 2006, one to be taken from the inhabitants of Ward One, one from the inhabitants of Ward Three, one from the inhabitants of Ward Five, and one from the inhabitants of Ward Seven, for three Superintendents of Smith's Agricultural School to serve for two years from the first Monday of January 2006, for one Elector under the Oliver Smith Will for two years from the first Wednesday of May, 2006, for two Trustees of Forbes Library Under the Will of Charles E. Forbes for four years from the first Monday of January, 2006 and for two Trustees for Trustees Under the Will of Charles E. Forbes for two years from the first Monday of January, 2006 (to fill a vacancy).

They will also give in their votes, Yes or No on the following question:

**QUESTION 1--** Shall the City of Northampton accept sections 3 to 7 inclusive of Chapter 44B of the General Laws, as proposed by a petition signed by at least five percent of the registered voters of this city, a summary of which appears below?

Sections 3 to 7 of Chapter 44B of the General Laws of Massachusetts, also known as the Community Preservation Act, establish a dedicated funding source to acquire and preserve (1) open space; which includes parks, conservation land, wildlife preserves, public drinking water supplies and scenic areas, farm land and forests; (2) acquire and restore historic buildings and sites; (3) create and preserve affordable housing. In Northampton, the Community Preservation Act will be funded by an additional surcharge of 3% on the Annual tax levy on real property and by annual funds distributed by the state from a trust created by the Act.

If the voters approve the Act, the following will be exempt from the surcharge:

(1) Owner occupied housing when the owner qualifies for low-income housing or low-or-moderate-income senior housing; (2) \$100,000 of the value of each taxable parcel of residential real property. Any taxpayer receiving a regular property tax abatement or exemption will also receive a corresponding full or partial reduction in the community Preservation Act surcharge.

**A Community Preservation Committee will be established to study preservation resources/possibilities/needs. It will be composed of local citizens who will make annual recommendations to the City Council on the use of the funds. All expenditures will be subject to an annual audit. At least 10% of the funds from each fiscal year will be spent, or reserved for later spending, on each of the Act's three preservation purposes; (1) open space; (2) historic resources; and (3) affordable housing.**
