National Pearl Harbor Remembrance Day December 7, 2021

WHEREAS,

National Pearl Harbor Remembrance Day is a holiday in which we solemnly remember the attack on the United States, and all those who were killed on that tragic day 80 years ago, and

WHEREAS,

this surprise attack which was described by President Franklin Delano Roosevelt as, “a date which will live in infamy”, led to the escalation of World War II, and

WHEREAS,

the City of Northampton wishes to honor the 2,403 Americans who lost their lives that day, six of them from Massachusetts, as well as the 1,143 Americans wounded in the attack. We also continue to honor those who are still with us and fought so fiercely so that more were not killed; and

WHEREAS,

this day reminds us not only of the sacrifices of so many Americans including the survivors from Western Massachusetts, but also reminds us of our resilience as a country and our ability to join together to mourn our losses, comfort those who are grieving, and defend our freedom, and so

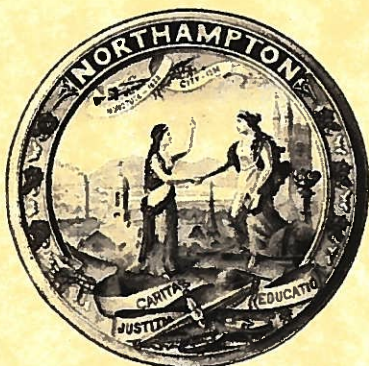
