### **R-24.030 A Resolution In Support of The Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) Transition Plan in Northampton**

WHEREAS the Americans With Disabilities Act, the most far-reaching extension of civil rights protections following the Civil Rights Act of 1964, was enacted in 1990 by overwhelming majorities of the United States Congress; and

WHEREAS on October 2nd, 2020, Former Mayor Narkewicz adopted Northampton's ADA Self-Evaluation and Transition Plan to serve Northampton's residents by strengthening the City's capacity for providing equal access to people with disabilities in public programs, services, and activities; and

WHEREAS Northampton's ADA Transition plan reflects Northampton's enduring values of equity and accessibility for all; and

WHEREAS the ADA Transition Plan states that "the City needs to reinvigorate its commitment to reducing operational, structural, and communication barriers that limit the participation of people with disabilities in the life of the community";

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that present and future City Councilors familiarize themselves with the ADA Transition Plan; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City Council applies the ADA Transition Plan's guidelines as a lens to assess items and projects that come before it for approval; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that City Council recommends that the ADA Coordinator periodically report to City Council on the progress of the City's implementation of the ADA transition plan; and
