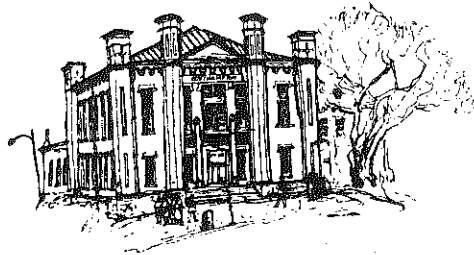


Proclamation

WORKERS' MEMORIAL DAY Thursday, April 28, 2016

WHEREAS, the health and safety of America's workers is an abiding concern of all its citizens; and

WHEREAS, every year tens of thousands of Americans are killed by workplace injuries and occupational disease, and tens of thousands more are permanently disabled, and millions are injured or made ill; and

WHEREAS, in 1970 Congress passed the Occupational Safety and Health Act, promising every worker the right to a safe job; and

WHEREAS, in a global economy worker conditions anywhere in the world are in a real sense American worker and American consumer concerns as well; and

WHEREAS, Workers' Memorial Day is an opportunity to highlight the preventable nature of most workplace incidents and ill health and to promote improvements in workplace safety; and

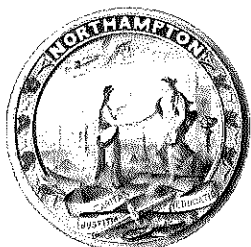
